# How to take care of a Wisteria

### 1. Taxonomy

Wisteria is a genus of flowering plants in the legume family, usually found in the Honshu, Kyushu and the Shikoku area in Japan.

#### 2. Preferred Environment

Place at location where you can get a lot of sunshine. Do not dry plant keep hydrated at all times during May to April.

#### 3. Soil

### 4. Fertilizer

Apply topdressing in May. Use compound fertilizer. Not necessary if flower not in bloom.

Apply mid-winter manure on top during Jan to Feb. Mixture of Oil cake, poultry manure and compound manure in the ratio of 2:2:1

Apply additional dressing if necessary during June to Sep. Apply more if the vine is not growing.


### 5. When to transplant

Transplant Wisteria once every 3 years on to a different pot the same size during Feb to Mar.

#### 6. When to trim


FLOWER BUD REMOVAL (MAY)

After the blooming season, trim the Wisteria as shown below. Cut 2cm below the bud to preserve energy for the plant.




# SUMMER TRIM (JULY)

Leave 50~60cm of the vine and trim excessive length. If the vine is too long, it will hinder sunshine and ventilation. Remove other unnecessary vines if required.



## **SUMMER TRIM 2 (SEPTEMBER)**

Trim newly grown vine at the length of 20cm (70cm overall) and remove other excessive vines if necessary.




# WINTER TRIM (JANUARY)

During January, Trim the leaf bud for more flowers. Characteristics between the Flower bud and leaf bud I shown below.


Characteristics of a Flower bud.

The bud has an oval, round appearance. Usually grows where the flowers came out the previous season.



Characteristics of a Leaf bud.

Leaf buds are usually pointy and grows where there is not much exposure to sunlight. Grows at the bottom of a long vine.



#### How to Trim

- 1. Cut off all dead leaves.
- 2. Cut excessively long vines to prevent thick vines
- 3. Predict where the flower will blossom and cut buds that are close to each other in order to keep distance between each flower.
- 4. Trim unnecessary vines such as ones that are facing straight up. Vines that grow straight up and down are subject of removal.
- 5. Trim vines that are too long as shown below. Wisteria flowers usually grow up to 30cm~40cm from the flower bud. Therefore, excessive vines may not look good when in full bloom the following year. Limit to only 3~5 flower buds on each branch as shown below.
